St David's Class Curriculum Overview Autumn 1

English – We will be reading Short and Spooky stories as our class book in English and developing our skills of comprel We will learn what a fronted adverbial is and then use the our writing. We will practise our handwriting, learning joins and ensuring letter formation is correct. Spellings will stuck in their Homework books on a Friday and tested the following Friday.

Maths – We will be looking at the value of digits and how to represent them in different ways. We will be ordering, comparing and rounding numbers. Year 4 will also be working with negative numbers and Roman numerals. We will then move onto addition and subtraction using a variety of methods and equipment. The children will also learn column addition and subtraction. We will continue to learn our times tables through Rock Star Tables. We will revise our x2, x5 and x10. Year 3 will then look at x3 whilst Year 4 learn x6. With all aspects of maths, applying it to real life situations is important. At home, please help your child with understanding time and recognising simple times such as o'clock, half past, quarter past and quarter to.
